## SYMBOL

Sefton Youth Making Better Opportunities with Leaders (SYMBOL) meetings are an opportunity for young people to meet and work collaboratively with key decision makers in Sefton.

Young people are involved in the planning and delivery of SYMBOL activity and attendees vote on the topics that are important to them.

Being a part of a SYMBOL activity means a young person can play an active role in their community, with a direct line of communication with key decision makers, such as Councillors, Senior Managers from Sefton Council and representatives from Public Health, Merseyside Police and more. SYMBOL meetings are held three times a year.

SYMBOL meetings have covered topics including: -Education

- -Mental and Physical Wellbeing
- -Climate Change
- -Racism and Division



### 2 THE MEETING

The meeting took place on Thursday 08th June 2023 at Bootle Town Hall.

The theme for this meeting was Cost of Living - this was decided by the young people at the last meeting.

During the meeting we discussed what young people had noticed about the cost of living crisis and what could be done locally to help young people during the cost of living crisis.

Youth groups and young people with an interest in youth voice were invited to the event.

In total there were 40 participants at the meeting, 24 of which were aged between 13-24.

# **GUEST SPEAKERS**

The first guest speaker on the evening was Andrea Watts - Executive Director (People) Sefton Council.

Andrea gave a presentation about the current situation in Sefton relating to the cost of living crisis and the actions that the Council has taken.

Some key points were:

- <u>5206 food vouchers</u> have been provided to families and residents who are struggling
- <u>620</u> people were given access to Winter Clothing Grants
- <u>663 vitamin supplements</u> were given out to children under 19 at Family Wellbeing Centres and the May Logan Centre
- All 13 Family Wellbeing Centres are now fully kitted with <u>period poverty boxes</u>



The next speaker on the evening was Debbie Shelley - South Sefton Food Bank.

Debbie talked to young people about the opportunities that South Sefton Food Bank offers to the community. The young people also actively participated by asking some questions.

Some key points raised were:



<u>10,137 vouchers</u> were redeemed from children from April 2022 - March 2023

This food bank also offers things other than food:

- Help with gas and electricity
- Vodafone SIM cards
- Projects such as cookery and level 1 courses

There is also a pantry accessible to the community where people can purchase 10 items for £3.50.

## WORKSHOP 1

Young people were given 5 different topics (leisure, food, transport, housing/home, other) and were asked to give examples on what they noticed in relation to the cost of living.

#### FOOD

Ordering a takeaway is expensive now The price of my favourite sweets have gone up

Weekly shopping has inflated Essentials have increased in price but decreased in size

Food banks are being used more and more which means people are finding themselves in a food crisis

#### TRANSPORT

More people are walking and cycling Young people need ID for trains or you get charged an adult ticket

Insurance and price of cars has increased a lot

> Petrol and diesel have increased

I have noticed taxis are dear

Bus tickets are more expensive for young people but reduced for adults

Getting to college is more Transport strikes were due to the cost of living and low wages which caused serious problems for work and education



#### HOUSING

The bidding prices of houses have increased

Electricity and gas have increased a lot

Mortgages are increasing each year or even each month which stops people buying houses or makes them have to move



Water bills



Interest rates have gone up

People renting are paying more

Household items are more

#### LEISURE

Bowling is more than it used to be

Gym membership has increased

X-Box games have gone up

Going swimming is too much money - £7 for an hour

Theatre and cinema tickets are too expensive now - around £10 for a cinema ticket

Book prices have increased

Subscriptions to streaming services like Netflix have increased massively due to the success

#### OTHER

Shoes/trainers are more expensive

Online education has increased such as online courses

Parking for cars



School uniforms have become unaffordable for some, meaning that kids are going to school without PE kits for example

Hygiene products are a lot more Clothing is more expensive but bad quality

## <sup>10</sup> WORKSHOP 2

The young people at the meeting were asked to create posters to find solutions to the Cost of Living Crisis locally.

Young People said:

Free school meals, uniform and supplies More support for mental health

More free youth clubs

Free therapy for children and young people

Vouchers for school supplies

Free taster days for activities

Free public transport to get to school All young people should be given a travel pass Help young people to get a job

Give young people warm places to go

Vouchers for during school holidays

Spaces in school where young people can go when their mental health is bad Reduced cost for school meals

Cheaper access to swimming pools

## RECOMMENDATIONS

Having reviewed all of the comments from the young people and listening to the Guest Speakers, Sefton Young Advisors have pulled together the following recommendations;

1. Sefton Council should raise awareness through social media or posters etc of support available such as South Sefton Food Bank and community spaces for both warmth and leisure.

2. Sefton Council could recommend that schools adapt their uniform rules to make sure it is accessible for all children.


3. We recommend that the Council revise and decrease prices of leisure activities such as swimming, for example introducing a reduced entry fee for young people on one evening a week.

4. Public transport fees could also be revised, for example abolishing the upfront cost of the 16-17 and 18-25 discount cards. And, for transport staff to accept other forms of official ID like a Citizen Card.


## FEEDBACK

#### Q1 - This event has met my expectations...




#### Q2 - The delivery of this event has been professional and of a high quality




