The purpose of the Sefton cycle map is to suggest convenient routes, which can either be used to get from 'A' to 'B', or for a leisurely cycle ride. In doing so, the map suggests "Advisory" routes which we think are relatively safe and convenient. The map also highlights existing cycle facilities such as cycle tracks and cycle lanes. You can also venture further afield by taking your bike on the train, free on local services.


