Steve White's advice as follows:

Phil.

I cannot believe NE proposed translocation as it would be a flagrant breach of the Habitats Regulations.

Sand Lizards are a feature of the SAC.

By suggesting that Sand Lizards might be translocated would, in effect, concede a likely significant adverse impact on the SAC.

In that case the developer would need to show that the housing could not be built elsewhere, could not be fully mitigated by measures within the development site and that going ahead with housing was of 'overriding public interest'.

Since as far as is known there are no Sand Lizards on the site itself there would be none to translocate from it (if there were they would be legitimate, perhaps).
