

If you are a victim of domestic abuse it is vital that you get advice about your housing options as soon as possible.

If you are being supported by a specialist domestic abuse worker e.g. Sefton's Independent Domestic Violence Advocates (IDVA) or Sefton Women and Children's Aid (SWACA), they will support you to contact the Housing Options Team to arrange a joint assessment of your needs and options.

If you are not currently receiving domestic abuse support, you can get this from local Sefton services. A range of help can be provided depending on your needs and circumstances, including crisis support to help keep you and your family safe, emotional support for your and or your children, and advocating on your behalf with different agencies.

It is not always necessary for the victim of domestic abuse to leave their home; if it is safe for you to do so the Council will work with you and support agencies to help you to remain in your home.

If it is decided that you need to move, then the Council and support staff will work with you to find appropriate alternative accommodation. This accommodation may be temporary in the first instance e.g. a refuge or temporary accommodation.

You can register for local social housing through Property Pool Plus and you may receive a high priority for rehousing because of your currently situation. However, being registered does not guarantee that you will be offered housing or how long that may take.

You could try to find housing in the private rented sector. Our Housing Options service may be able to advise you how to find out what housing is available locally and how to apply for help with your housing costs.

- Applying to our Housing Benefits service for a Discretionary Housing Payment for securing private sector tenancy (if you are already in receipt or Housing Benefit or Universal Credit)
