Demolition Progress

The redevelopment project is well underway, and the transformation is starting to take shape.

The iconic Mons Square canopy has now been carefully removed using a 300-tonne crane—a striking moment that signals the start of something new.



Building 5 demolished

Further along, the old Building 5 has been completely demolished. This was once home to familiar names like One Below, Miss Scorpio, H Samuel, and 3 Mobile. Work has also begun on taking down Building 2, which previously housed Style, WH Smith, and Superdrug.

Meanwhile, the Palatine flats have been fully demolished, and excavation of the building's slab is underway.

Importantly, much of the demolition material is being processed on-site to create fill material for re-use. This sustainable approach means less waste and a greener future for our town.

What's Next?

The coming weeks will see continued demolition of Building 2 and further excavation of the Palatine Building slab. These steps are essential to prepare the ground for the exciting new development that will transform the town centre into a lively hub for shopping, leisure, and community life.

Regeneration Brainery

As part of our collaborative social value efforts with AY, K2, and AtkinsRéalis, VINCI Building supported a Regeneration Brainery (an academy for 'bright young minds') careers session and site tour delivered by Hannah Bailey, Josh Smith, and Rob Symons.



Forty-six per-cent of the students taking part were female and 75% of students met at least one of our social mobility criteria.

Students were split into two groups, with one group taking part in a site tour led by VINCI and supported by design team members, while the other engaged in a hands-on master planning workshop led by K2.

After a short break, the groups swapped activities to ensure everyone experienced both sessions.

The day concluded with a feedback session, giving students valuable insight into construction, design, and regeneration careers.
